### **BALLOT PROPOSALS**

Prop 1: Adds an Equal Rights Amendment, provides New Yorkers with more protections against discrimination and unfair treatments.

Prop 2: Expands the jurisdiction of Department of Sanitation to include more city-owned property. Expand Mayor's waste container initiative.

**Prop 3:** Requires fiscal statements from City Council for proposed legislations; Can create more red tape and make law-making less efficient.

**Prop 4:** Gives the Mayor more control over any legislations proposed by City Council involving the Police Department, Fire Department, and the Department of Corrections.

Prop 5: Requires additional steps in the city's annual assessment of city facilities

Prop 6: Formalizes the role of Chief Business Diversity Officer, offers the Mayor the power to approve film permits, and combine archive boards.

Prop 1 is an amendment to the New York State Constitution. Prop 2 thru 6 is a revision to the New York City Charter.
