Working Families Tax Credit (WFTC)

A Bill to Provide 3 Million New York Families up to \$1,600 per year

Why tax credits?

Tax Credits:

- Are distributed through existing state tax infrastructure, making them the most efficient way to get money directly into the hands of New Yorkers.
- Empower families to choose how to spend their refund and prioritize their most critical needs.
- Help the New York State
 Government meet its goal to reduce
 child poverty by 50% over 10 years
- Support small business by reinvesting money into the community and by helping employees afford a babysitter when their child gets sick, or fix their car so they can drive to work.

How will the WFTC help New York families?

- Removes the harmful minimum income requirements that result in our poorest families receiving the smallest supports
- Fixes the exclusion of Individual Tax Identification Number (ITIN) filers to the EITC
- Introduces a quarterly payment system that gets families the money they need when they need it

- Expands eligible income levels
- Increases the maximum credit to \$1,600 per child, indexed to inflation
- Provides a \$100 credit per child regardless of income
- Eliminates the cap on the number of children eligible to receive a credit
- Includes 17 year olds

Why the WFTC now?

- Simplifies the tax system by consolidating 3 benefits into one bigger, better, streamlined credit, making it easier for families to predict when they will receive payments
- Treats all families equally whether they live in rural or urban regions of New York State





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
Figure 2. How were Child Tax Credit Funds Spent?
