What is on the ballot?

Ballot proposals are changes to the New York City Charter that can modify distribution of power in our city.

The five of following six ballot proposals are put forth by the New York City Charter Revision Commission, convened by Mayor Adams.

- 1** Allows expanding the ski trails of an Olympic Sports complex in Essex County and adds 2,500 acres of forest land to Adirondack Park.
- 2** Fast-tracks some housing applications in some districts and removes City Council's approval for some projects.
- 3** Establishes an expedited process for smaller land use changes and removes City Council review for most projects.
- 4** Creates an affordable housing appeals board made of the Mayor, respective Borough President, and Council Speaker to review and overturn some Council housing decisions.
- 5** Consolidates paper borough maps into one centralized digital City Map at the Department of City Planning.
- 6** Moves local elections to Presidential election years.

** To adopt this proposal, a change in the State law is also needed.
