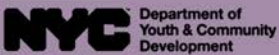

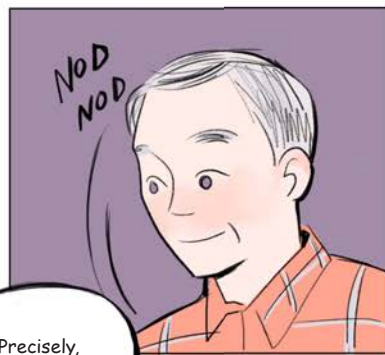


They're shaped by the Constitution and how it has been interpreted throughout history. For example, look at the Civil War era—

Yeah, kinda like today. There's a lot of division over immigration, voting rights, and who gets to be "American".

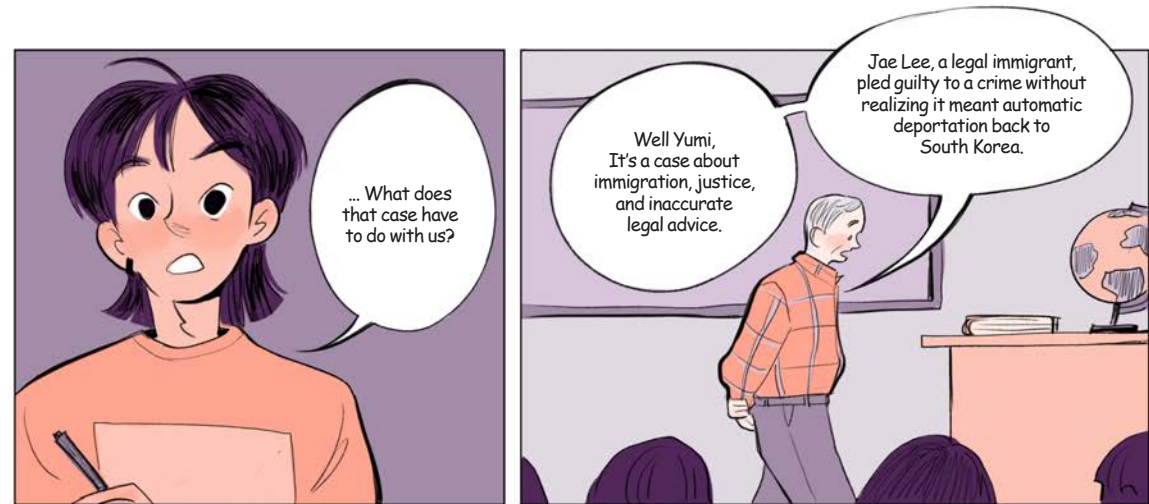

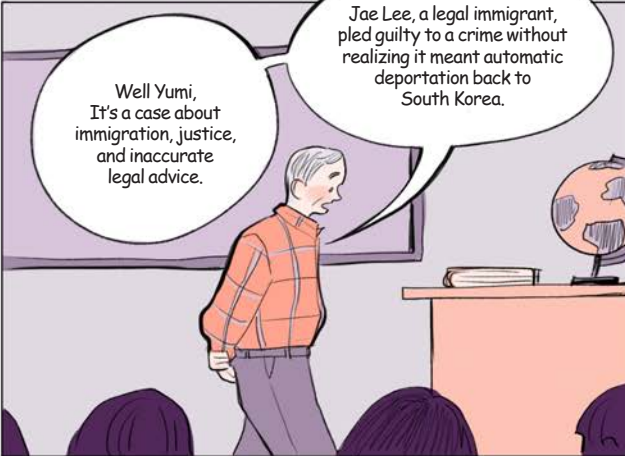


And that's why we're also looking at a Supreme Court case that connects history to the present: *Jae Lee v. United States* (2017)

Well Yumi, It's a case about immigration, justice, and inaccurate legal advice.

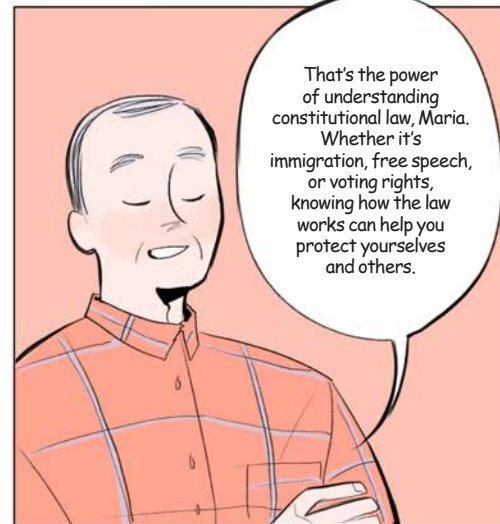
Jae Lee, a legal immigrant, pled guilty to a crime without realizing it meant automatic deportation back to South Korea.



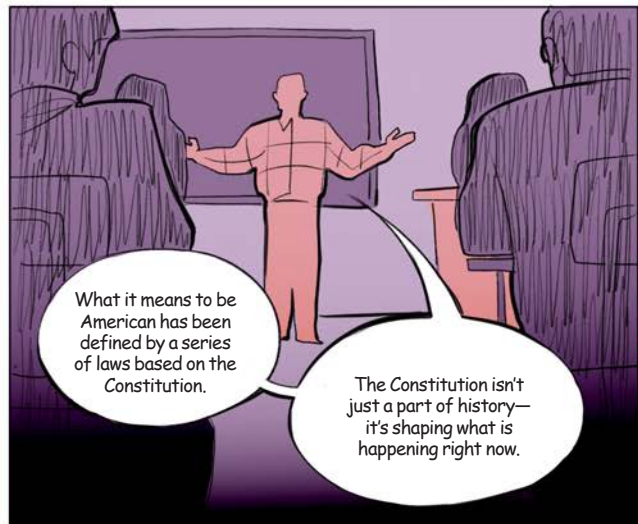
The Supreme Court ruled on whether his lawyer's poor advice violated his rights.

That's the power of understanding constitutional law, Maria. Whether it's immigration, free speech, or voting rights, knowing how the law works can help you protect yourselves and others.

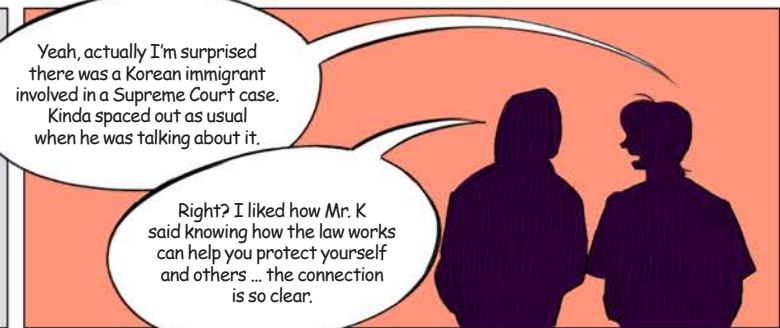
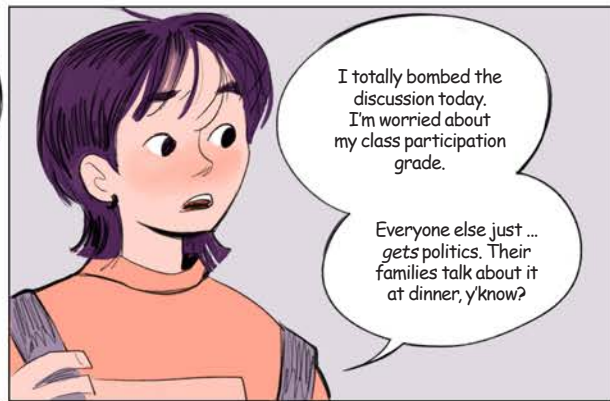
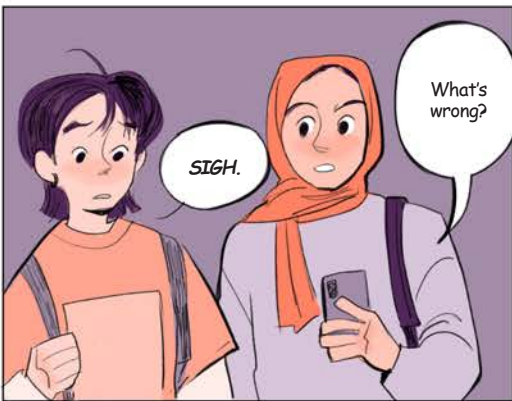


What it means to be American has been defined by a series of laws based on the Constitution.

The Constitution isn't just a part of history— it's shaping what is happening right now.

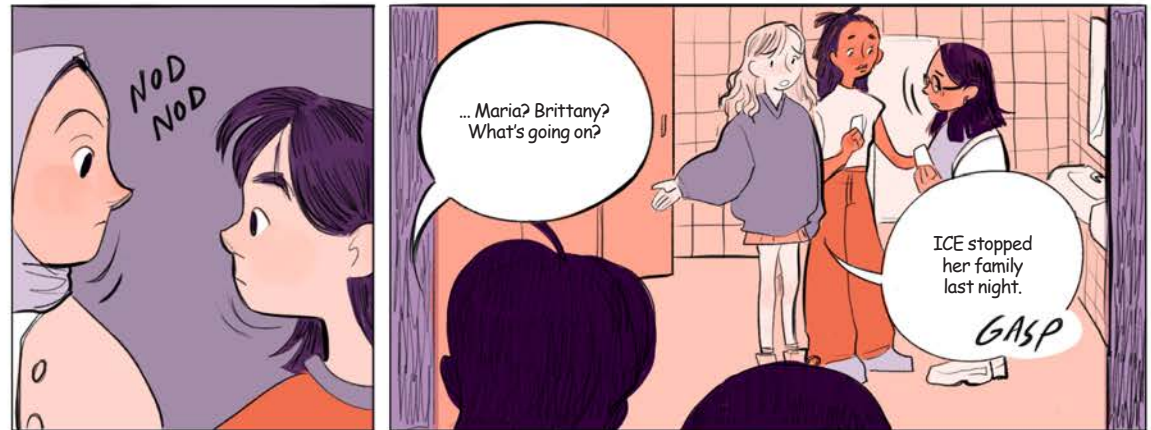

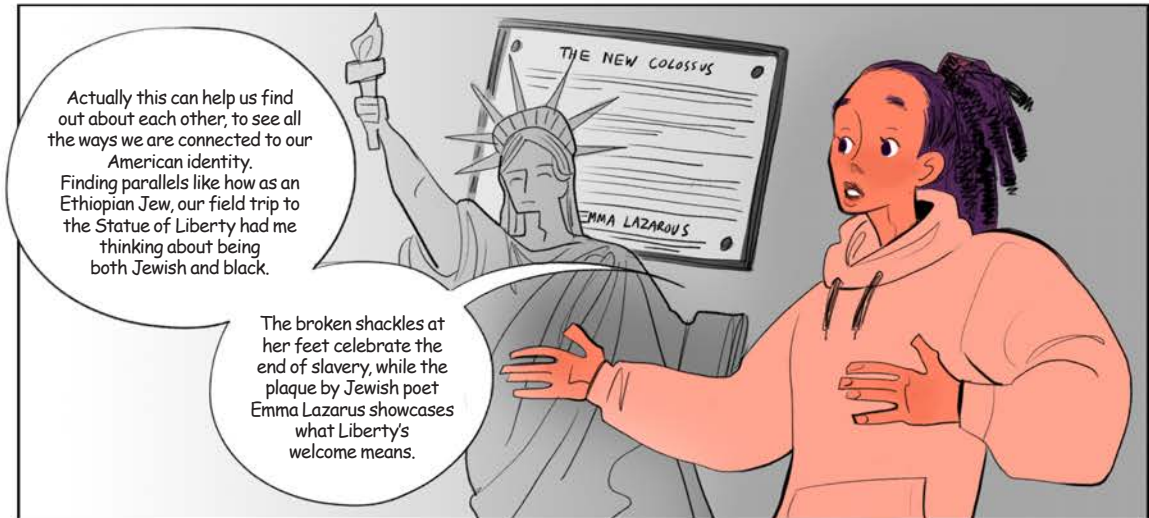
Did y'all know that "woke" used to mean fighting for justice? There was a youth group in the 1800s called the **Wide Awakes**.

They opposed slavery and promoted fair elections.

They were actually **Republican** under our first Republican president - Lincoln!



Wow, that's actually pretty neat?



Actually this can help us find out about each other, to see all the ways we are connected to our American identity. Finding parallels like how as an Ethiopian Jew, our field trip to the Statue of Liberty had me thinking about being both Jewish and black.

The broken shackles at her feet celebrate the end of slavery, while the plaque by Jewish poet Emma Lazarus showcases what Liberty's welcome means.



That's a great idea! I think I have a lot to add from my experiences, too. It reminds me of some of the work that people who led the Know Your Rights Workshops were doing.

We can even share some of the "Know Your Rights" cards that they provide in multiple languages!

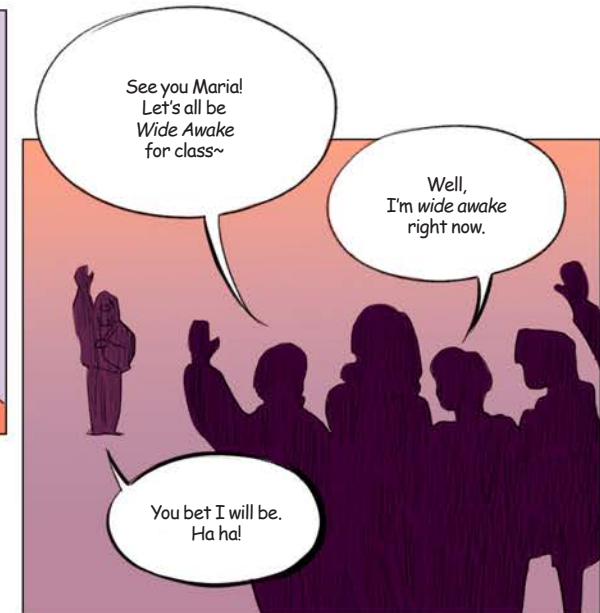
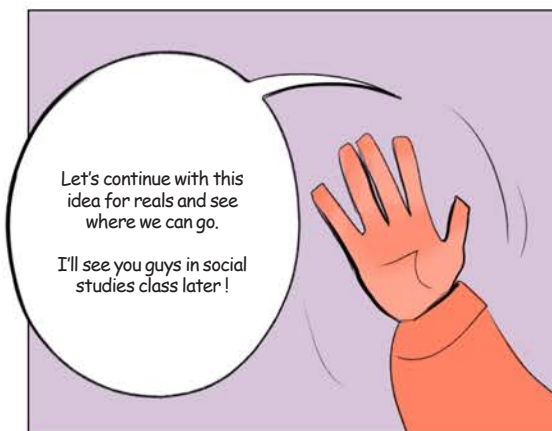
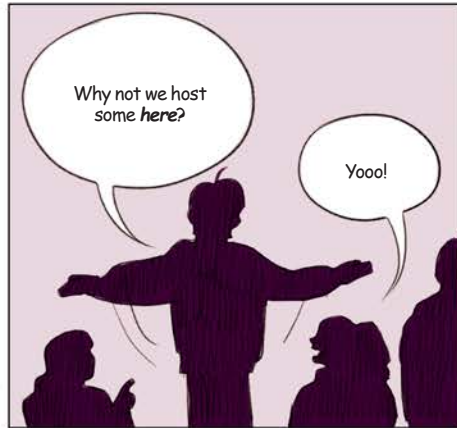
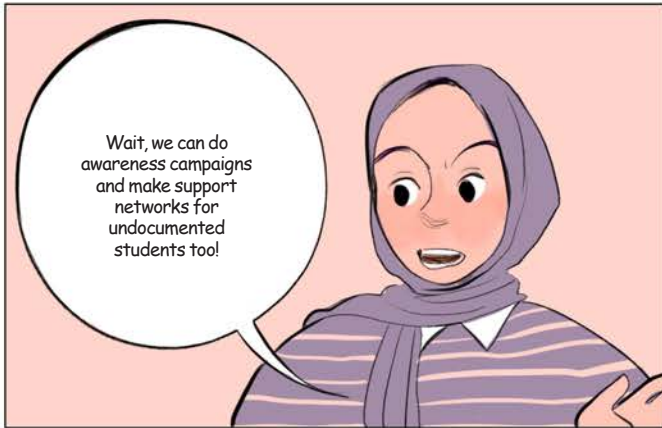

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

- Remain silent and not answer any questions
- Refuse searches or entry without a warrant signed by a judge
- Know if and why you are being detained or arrested
- Refuse to sign anything and ask to speak with an attorney
- Record what is happening to you and others

If you have contact with an agent, you can give or show them this card.



I AM EXERCISING MY RIGHT TO REMAIN SILENT.

Please be informed that I am choosing to exercise my right to remain silent. I am also exercising my right to refuse to sign anything until my attorney reviews it. If I am detained, I request to contact my attorney immediately. My attorney's contact information is:

I know that...

- I have rights. I have dignity. I am not alone.
- I have the right to speak to my attorney.
- I have the right to refuse to sign anything before my attorney reviews it.
- Anything I say can be used against me.
- I have the right to remain silent in ANY situation.
- I can show officials this card or say out loud that I am remaining silent.
